LOGIC AND ACCURACY TEST (L&A): Testing of the electronic voting machines is scheduled for March 7, 2025, at 9:30am at the Martin County Supervisor of Elections Office, 135 SE Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd. in Stuart, FL.

TOWN ELECTION, MARCH 18, 2025 – One (1) Town Commission seat for a two-year term and two (2) Town Commission seats, each for a four-year term will be up for election this coming March 18, 2025. The seats are currently held by Penelope Townsend, Patricia Warner, and Joseph Taddeo.

The qualifying period for all candidates desiring to run in the March 18th election, including incumbents who wish to run for re-election, will be February 14 through February 28, 2025. Interested candidates please contact Town Clerk Kimberly Kogos at 772-545-0105 or come in person to Town Hall, 2 Bridge Road, Hobe Sound, FL to submit the appropriate qualifying paperwork. Candidates must be a Jupiter Island resident and be registered to vote on Jupiter Island in Martin County. **NOTE: Proof of filing of Form 1 must be provided to Town Clerk in order to qualify.**

Anyone not registered to vote in Martin County/Town of Jupiter Island and wishes to register **and/or wishes to receive a Vote-By-Mail ballot** must contact the Martin County Supervisor of Elections, 135 SE Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd. in Stuart, FL 34994, 772-288-5637 or elections@MartinVotes.gov **NO LATER THAN FEBRUARY 20, 2025.**

Jupiter Island registered voters who vote in person are requested to bring their driver's license for identification purposes. Voters also may vote by Vote-By-Mail Ballot, which must be received by Town Clerk Kimberly Kogos no later than 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 18, in order to be counted in this election. Vote-By-Mail ballots will be available for pick up: (1) by the registered voter starting Thursday, March 6, or (2) by an authorized requestor (*Affidavit required*) on behalf of the registered voter after VBM ballots have been mailed, (i.e. March 10th). (*Note: an Affidavit is required which can be obtained at Town Hall*)
