Proposed Ordinance 394 – Home Based Businesses

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN COMMISSION OF THE TOWN OF JUPITER ISLAND, MARTIN COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 5, ARTICLE III OF THE TOWN'S CODE OF ORDINANCES TO DELETE THE USE OF THE TERM "OCCUPATIONAL LICENSES" AND REPLACE IT WITH "BUSINESS TAX"; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

 - c. Section 553.73, Florida Statutes, relating to the Florida Building Code; or

d. Section 633.202, Florida Statutes, relating to the Florida Fire Prevention Code.

In accordance with the provisions of controlling law, even notwithstanding the fact that an exemption noted above may apply, the Town of Jupiter Island hereby publishes the following information:

1. Summary of the proposed ordinance *(must include a statement of the public purpose, such as serving the public health, safety, morals and welfare)*:

Proposed Ordinance 394 changes the reference of “occupational licenses” to “business tax”, incorporates Home-Based Business into the Business Tax section of the code, and reduces Business tax.

2. An estimate of the direct economic impact of the proposed ordinance on private, for-profit businesses in the Town of Jupiter Island, if any: **N/A**
